On November 23, 1887 in Thibodaux, Louisiana, white vigilantes killed unarmed black laborers and their families during a spree lasting more than two hours known as “The Thibodaux Massacre”. The bodies of the victims are believed to be buried in a mass gravesite in Thibodaux on Narrow Street.

The Louisiana 1887 Memorial Committee is raising money needed to explore the site so that the remains can be verified. This is being done with the help of clergy and descendants of victims.
